They examine the form and decide if the trip is well planned and if there is adequate funding for the trip. Once the trip is ap-

proved, the organizer then arranges transportation and makes any necessary admission or ticket purchases.

Fundraising Continues for Day Care

Last issue, a story ran about the newly designed playground for the Beaver Center. On top of that, there are several other projects that have been completed or are currently in the works.

Recently, the roof at the Beaver Center was replaced. The cost of this, combined with the playground expense, a new furnace that is required at Woodland and other miscellaneous upgrades that need to be made at both centers, add up very fast. According to James Cahill, the projected combined cost of these repairs and upgrades comes to around \$133,000.

What exactly is being done about this large sum? A few months ago letters were sent to a number of

businesses and organizations in the area in an attempt to find grant money that is available to help for projects of this nature. More than ten letters were sent out so far by Day Care explaining our situation and asking for whatever help we could receive. Recently, we have received commitment from some organizations and are growing closer to reaching our goal. Here is a breakdown of some of our recent donations:

Reason For Change

Congratulations to Julie Rouse on being named the new Day Care secretary.

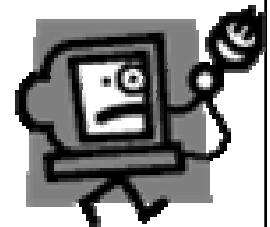
Governor Names October Iowa Learning Disabilities Month

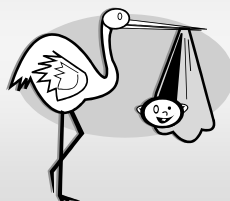
